Directions to Near Moss Farm from M6 Junction 33

- Leave the M6 at Galgate, Junction 33.
- Turn left (south) on the A6 towards Garstang/Preston.
- Travel for 1.2 miles, and turn right at the junction signed Cockerham.
- Travel for 1.5 miles. At the "T" junction, turn right to Cockerham village.
- Travel for 0.3 miles to a second "T" junction (by Manor Public House).
- Turn left (west) on to the A588 towards Pilling/Blackpool.
- Travel for 3.2 miles to the junction on the left which is Gulf Lane. (This junction is just before the Pilling boundary sign.)
- Turn into Gulf Lane and follow the road round by a farm for a distance of 0.8 miles. Near Moss Farm is on your right. (X marks the spot!)
